# CCC Heep Woh College 2023–2024 Monthly School Report February 2024

#### 1. Farewell to Graduates Assembly

From 27th and 28th February, I, Mr. Wong Chun Tat and Ms. Chan Yi Man Julia, the Vice-Principals, Ms. Cheung Pak Yu Maggie, the Assistant Principal, Mr. Leung Wing Fai, the Department Head of Citizenship and Social Development (CS), CS teachers, S.5 Class Teachers, other subject teachers, accompanied our students to visit Heyuan on the Mainland Study Tour.

On the evening of 23rd February, the Guidance Committee and school social workers organized a forum for S.1 & S.2 parents. Mr. Kwan Chi Ho, the Guidance Master, shared some tips to help parents understand how to help parents face their children's difficulties in their academic progress.

#### 4. Report from Subject Departments

#### **Mathematics Department**

- (1) On 5th February, S.2 Mathematics teachers designed a group assignment of designing various Geometric figures for students using a protractor and a ruler for the new syllabus. S.2 students were required to make drafts on paper and then plot their designed deliverable figures on our school playground to display their talents in Mathematics and Visual Arts. This assignment has also facilitated students' learning of polygons, angles and congruent figures. Ms. Chu Ka Man, Ms. Ng Man Wai and Mr. Tsui Ho Man were responsible for the project.
- (2) On 16th February, the Mathematics Department arranged for S.6 students to join the 13th HKDSE Mathematics Mock Examination to provide opportunities for students to drill their examination skills.
- (3) On 20th February, the Mathematics Society organized a RUMMIKUB competition for our students. Fifty-six S.1 S.5 students actively joined the competition. The winners were 3A Pang Oi Yee, 3B Mok Lam, 1B Tang Tsz Shan and 4A Cheng Hoi Lam. They will represent our school to participate in the CCC Secondary Schools RUMMIKUB competition 2024.

(4) Professional Development Activity/Activities:

On 6th February, Mr. Li WK attended a seminar on the topic of "Hong Kong Students' Mathematical Competency Shown in the Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) 2022 Study for Hong Kong" organized by the Education Bureau.

#### **Chemistry Department (Science KLA)**

One team of four S.5 Science students entered the final round of the "Hong Kong Polytechnic University SCIENCE Young Talents Competition" organized by the Hong Kong Polytechnic University.

#### **Biology Department (Science KLA)**

On 24th February, twenty-three S.5 students participated in the Little Dr. Flu Workshop organized by Li Ka Shing Faculty of Medicine of the University of Hong Kong.

#### **Economics Department (PSHE KLA)**

- (1) On 25th February, the Economics Society member shared a book titled 「看成語搞懂經濟學」 on the Economics Instagram platform. It is a book on how to use Chinese idioms to learn Economics through short stories.
- (2) On 29th February, the Economics Department invited an expert from the Census and Statistics Department to deliver to our F.5 students. The talk titled 'Statistical Talks for Secondary School Students—the Measurement of Hong Kong Economic Performance' was delivered by Dr. Xiao Jingyi, Zoe, the Research Manager from the Census and Statistics Department. A total of twenty-five students taking Economics as an elective attended the talk to understand the national income statistics of Hong Kong.

#### **Geography Department (PSHE KLA)**

- (1) To arrange for Secondary 6 students to sit for two External Post Mock Examinations. They will be held in January and March 2024 respectively. The number of participants were 16 and 7 respectively.
- (2) Completed the Geography book sharing session on 24/1/2024 morning assembly, the theme of which was "Weather is not difficult to understand", which introduced to the students how typhoons are named and how clouds are observed.
- (3) The tender for the Geography and Music study tour to South Korea was finalized and the tendering process is underway.
- (4) To prepare for the S5 Geography field trip in this semester, we have applied to the school for the time slots for the 7th and 8th periods and after-school extra lessons on 20/3/2024. We have completed the quotation process and discussed the teaching materials with the tutor.
- (5) Participated in Jockey Club Solar Care Programme. A solar visit will be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Life-wide learning day.
- (6) A Humanities study tour on traditional industries in Hong Kong will be organized in collaboration with History and Chinese History on 23/3/2024 and 27/4/2024.

#### **Business, Accounting and Financial Studies Department (TE KLA)**

On 17th February, eighteen S6 students participated in a mock examination organised by the Lee Shau Kee School of Business and Administration of Hong Kong Metropolitan University.

#### **Physical Education Department**

On 19, 22 & 26 February, our school athletics team took part in the Inter-School Athletics Competition. We won 12 individual events and Boys C grade overall 3<sup>rd</sup> runner up.

- (3) Students from the school junior choir, senior choir, handchimes ensemble, Western orchestra, and Chinese orchestra will be taking part in the Joint School Music Competition in March and April.

## **Visual Arts Department**

On 5th February, Mr. Wan KM and Ms. Cheng SL had a second departmental meeting, which was held in the Visual Arts Room. Teachers shared teaching ideas and planned some following art activities for the near future.

#### 5. Report from Extra-Curricular Activities Committee

(1) On 2nd February, the Farewell to Graduates Assembly was held in the school hall. This was the first whole school gathering that resumed after the pandemic. Principal Dr. Chu shared a speech and lit the candles of the graduate representatives. Graduates then passed the fire to the junior students. All teachers sang a song on stage to bid farewell to the graduates.

- (2) The Dance Team participated in the 60<sup>th</sup> Dance Festival, Jazz and Street Group Dance, and was awarded the Distinction Award. The group involved twelve S.2 to S.5 students.
- (3) Two more interest classes started in the second term, the Handicraft Workshop and the Japanese Class. The classes began the first lessons in late February, with eight and twenty junior students enrolled respectively.

#### 6. Report from Career Guidance Committee

From 1st to 4th February, a tour to visit Taiwan National University was held. Thirty S.3–S.5 students participated in the tour to learn more about the study, social life and environmental sustainability policy in Taiwan.

#### 7. Report from the Discipline Committee

- (1) On 3rd February, a games booth about the concepts of anti-gambling was organized by the Hong Kong Lutheran Social Service for fourteen parents. This activity was co-organized with the school Parents-Teachers' Association.
- (2) On 17th and 18th February, a training camp was organized for the Prefects Team at the Don Bosco Camp Site at Cheung Chau by the social workers from Zion Social Service Limited.

#### 8. Report from the Academic Affairs Committee

On 23rd February, the first session of two subject selection talk was held for our Form 3 students. Department Heads of the elective subjects were invited give a brief introduction on their subject. The purpose was to prepare the students to make an informed choice on their senior secondary elective subjects. Ms Lau SH was the teacher-in-charge of this session.

## 9. Report from the Religious Education Committee

- (1) On 5th, 19th, and 26th February, the Christian Fellowship committee held meetings to prepare for the morning assembly promotion and the bi-weekly gatherings.
- (2) On 21st January, a training workshop for the Christian Fellowship committee was held. The theme was Worship Leading. We were grateful to have an alumnus as the guest speaker, Mr O Chin Wah (Music Ministry Officer, HKBU Chaplain's Office).
- (3) On 21st February, the "Love Coupon Fundraising Campaign" was held to support our school sponsoring body, the Hong Kong Council of the Church of Christ in China.
- (4) On 21st February, the Inter-School Christian Students Revival Camp promotion started.
- (5) On 23rd February, the Cell Group Luncheon for senior levels was held.
- (6) On 27th February, the After-school Interest Classes for S.2 students started, which included the Korean Language, Flour Doll Figurines, and Magic Tricks.

# 10. Report from the Parental Affairs Committee

On 3rd February, Parental Affairs Committee and Discipline Committee co-organised the 'Game Beyond' workshop for parents. It is hoped that parents can understand more about how to

# 11. Report from the Moral and Civic Education Committee

The Programme aims to promote students' awareness of the effects of Internet infringement and respect for creativity, originality, and intellectual property rights to students interestingly and interactively.

  - The MCE committee is working with the Religious Education Committee to design a school-based teaching material, "Time Management from the Bible," to enable S3 students dealing with multiple subjects to learn time management skills and attitudes.
